On February 24, 2011, Placer Gounty Water Agency (PCWA) (address PO. Box 6570, 144 Ferguson Road, Auburn, CA 95604) (filed with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) an Application for New License for Major Project. Existing Dam (License Application) for the Middle Fork American River Watershed, on the western slope of the Sierra Nevada mountain range, in Placer and El Dorado counties, California.

The MFP serves as a multi-purpose water supply and hydro-generation project designed to conserve and control waters of the Middle Fork American River, the Rubicon River, Duncan Creek, and North and South Fork Long Canyon creeks. The MFP facilities include two major storage reservoirs, five smaller regulating reservoirs and diversion pools, water conveyance systems, five powerhouses, gaging stations communication lines and power-lines, support facilities, roads and trails, and recreation facilities. The MFP was constructed and operates under a 50-year license, which was issued on March 13, 1963, by the Federal Power Commission, predecessor of the current FERC. The current license expires on February 28, 2013. PCWA is requesting renewal of its license to continue operation and maintenance of the MFP with a license term is based on the substantial costs associated with relicensing of the MFP, capital improvements, new environmental measures, programs, and facilities, and extensive monitoring and ongoing resource agency consultation to ensure continued re-The MFP serves as a multi-purpose water supply and California.

measures, programs, and facilities; and extensive monitoring and ongoing resource agency consultation to ensure continued resource protection over the term of the new license.

As described in the License Application, PCWA's Proposed Action includes, addition, removal, and modification of Project components, revisions to the existing FERC Project boundary, changes in Project operations, modification of testing and routine Project maintenance activities; new environmental programs, measures, and facilities designed to protect and enhance environmental and cultural resources; and construction or modification of Project facilities. The Proposed Action considers input from state and federal resource agencies, Native American Tribes, non-governmental organizations, and members of the public (collectively referred to as MFP relicensing participants) acquired during extensive consultation activities completed for the relicensing of the MFP.

The License Application was prepared utilizing FERC's Integrated Licensing Process (ILP) and pursuant to Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) §§ 4.32, 4.51, and 5.18. The License Application is composed of five volumes including public, critical energy infrastructure, confidential, and privileged informations.
