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CONTENT

Supporting Document I (SD I) summarizes Placer County Water Agency's (PCWA's) consultation efforts related to the relicensing of the Middle Fork American River Project (MFP or Project). As required in Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 5.6(d)(5), this report summarizes all contacts to date with federal and state resource agencies, Native American Tribes, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and other interested parties made in connection with preparing this Pre-Application Document (PAD).

Since 2004, PCWA has been conducting formal and informal meetings with the resource agencies, Native American Tribes, and other stakeholders to discuss the relicensing process, MFP facilities and operations, and to develop Technical Study Plans (TSPs). The tables in this supporting document identify all pertinent consultation conducted in association with the preparation of this PAD, including written correspondence, meetings, and important telephone conversations.

PCWA expects to continue to hold regular meetings as the relicensing process proceeds. The consultation record will be updated as the relicensing process proceeds and documented in PCWA's Application for New License.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

In August 2004, PCWA initiated informal consultation activities to support the preparation and filing of the PAD for the MFP. Over the last three years, PCWA has convened numerous meetings with representatives of federal and state resource agencies, Native American Tribes, local and regional authorities, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and the public. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC's or Commission's) Integrated Licensing Process (ILP) requires that an Applicant for a new license consult with interested parties (stakeholders) during the relicensing process. Title 18 of the CFR § 5.6(d)(5) requires that the PAD include a summary of contacts with stakeholders. Appendices A and B include lists of these contacts.

The consultation activities conducted by PCWA during preparation of the PAD over the last three years consisted of six key elements: (1) conducting early outreach activities; (2) developing a Process Plan and Schedule including Communication and Participation Protocols; (3) developing a Project Description and identifying potential Project Betterments/Improvements; (4) preparing an Existing Resource Information Report; (5) developing, implementing and reporting early data gathering activities; and (6) developing the proposed Technical Study Plans (TSPs) included in this PAD. A summary of these key consultation elements is provided below.

1.1 EARLY OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

PCWA initiated early outreach activities in 2004. Early outreach activities involved: meeting with individual state and federal resource agencies and Native American Tribes; conducting a workshop and other meetings with all of the stakeholders, including members of the public, NGOs, resource agencies, and Native American Tribes; conducting site tours and site visits; meeting with the FERC and; establishing a publicly-accessible website. The intent of these early outreach activities was to identify potential stakeholders and understand their resource interests, describe MFP facilities and operation to interest parties, and solicit existing resource information. PCWA also used these meetings to collaborate on the scope of early environmental and cultural data gathering activities. PCWA's early outreach activities are described further in the following.

Meetings with Resource Agencies and Native American Tribes

PCWA conducted a number of individual meetings with the resource agencies and Native American Tribes to discuss the MFP relicensing. As shown on Table SD I-1, PCWA convened 10 meetings with federal and state resource agencies between September 2004 and November 2007. During this same time period, PCWA also convened 13 outreach meetings with various Native American Tribes and conducted a field trip with the Native American tribes to tour the Project facilities.

Introductory Stakeholder Meeting

PCWA developed a potential stakeholder list that included federal and state agencies, Native American Tribes, local government, and members of the public that may be

affected by the Project (Appendix A). PCWA mailed all potential stakeholders on the list invitations to participate in an Introductory Stakeholder Meeting (Kick-Off Meeting). The Introductory Stakeholder Meeting was held on April 25, 2006. The purpose of the meeting was to provide all stakeholders with an overview of: (1) the FERC's ILP; (2) the MFP facilities, including operation and maintenance activities; (3) PCWA's relicensing goals, and; (4) early relicensing studies.

During this meeting, PCWA asked stakeholders to develop resource interest statements for discussion at future meetings. In addition, a Communications Protocol Subgroup was formed to collaboratively develop communication and participation protocols. The MFP Plenary Group, open to all interested stakeholders, was also formed to facilitate communication and decision-making during the relicensing. A list of the Plenary Group participants is provided in Appendix B.

Public Workshop

On May 23, 2006, PCWA hosted a Public Workshop to provide information on the MFP relicensing. PCWA arranged the workshop to provide the public with basic information about the relicensing process, the MFP facilities, levels of stakeholder involvement, communication tools, and environment and cultural resources in the vicinity of the MFP.

Plenary Meetings

PCWA convened 10 Plenary meetings between May 2006 and November 2007. As shown in Table SD I-2, major activities completed during these Plenary meetings included: presentations on existing MFP facilities and operations and proposed Project betterments/improvements; sharing of stakeholder interest statements (SD D); development and approval of the Communication and Participation Protocols (SD A), formation of Technical Working Groups (TWGs); and approval of the proposed TSPs (SD H). Technical Working Groups were established in June 2006. A list of TWG participants is provided in Appendix B.

Site Tours

As part of the early outreach activities, PCWA conducted three site tours to provide the stakeholders with an opportunity to view the Project facilities. The first was a two-day tour conducted on October 4 and 5, 2005. This tour was attended by members of various Native American Tribes interested in the relicensing of the MFP. The second and third tours were conducted on August 30, 2006 and September 27, 2007. As shown on Table SD I-3, these two tours were attended by a variety of stakeholders, including members of the public, resource agency representatives, and NGO representatives.

Site Visits

PCWA hosted four site visits in association with the development and implementation of the technical studies. The first trip was conducted on August 22, 2006 and was attended by resource agency representatives (Table SD I-3). The purpose of this trip was to visit the quantitative study sites associated with the geomorphology, riparian and aquatic

habitat mapping studies being conducted as part of the early data gathering activities. The other three site visits occurred on August 6-10, August 14-17, and October 24, 2007. As shown on Table SD I-3, these trips were attended by resource agency representatives, NGOs and members of the public, and focused on selecting instream flow modeling sites in association with the AQ 1 TSP (SD H).

Meetings with FERC

PCWA conducted three meetings with the FERC, Office of Energy Projects (OEP), Division of Hydropower Licensing in Washington D.C. On April 3, 2006, PCWA met with Mr. Mark Robinson, OEP Director. On March 15, 2007, PCWA met with Mr. James Fargo, FERC Project Manager assigned to the MFP. On November 1, 2007, PCWA met with Ann Miles, Director-Division of Hydropower Relicensing; Timothy Welch, Chief-Hydro Branch West; and Jim Fargo. These meetings were conducted to discuss the MFP relicensing process, clarify FERC's involvement, and discuss early outreach activities.

Website

PCWA established a public Internet website which can be accessed at <http://relicensing.pcwa.net/>. The website contains information regarding past and current relicensing activities, including meeting notices and agendas, meeting summaries, documents distributed to or received from participants, reference materials, and key decisions.

1.2 RELICENSING PROCESS PLAN DEVELOPMENT

PCWA developed a Relicensing Process Plan (SD A) in collaboration with the stakeholders. An overview of PCWA's proposed approach for relicensing of the MFP, including key milestones, was first presented to MFP stakeholders during the April 25, 2006. Introductory Stakeholder Meeting. Further discussions regarding the Plan occurred during Plenary meetings held on May 16, 2006, July 18, 2006, November 14, 2006, and May 8, 2007. During these meetings, stakeholders provided comments on PCWA's proposed approach and insights regarding the key attributes of relicensing plans used in other proceedings.

Communication and Participation Protocols (Protocols), a key element of the Relicensing Process Plan, were developed collaboratively with MFP stakeholders. The Protocols provide guidelines for participation in the relicensing process by interested parties including governmental agencies, NGOs, Native American Tribes, and unaffiliated members of the public. The Communications Protocol Subgroup (established on April 25, 2006) collaboratively developed draft Protocols that were provided to the Plenary in June and July 2006. Comments received were incorporated into the Final Protocol, which was approved by the Plenary group. The Final Protocols, provided in SD A, were distributed to MFP relicensing participants on March 9, 2007.

1.3 DEVELOPMENT OF PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND POTENTIAL PROJECT BETTERMENTS/IMPROVEMENTS

PCWA prepared a brief Initial Project Description to provide stakeholders with an overview of the MFP facilities and operations. The Initial Project Description was provided to the stakeholders as part of the early outreach activities. A more detailed Draft Project Description, including potential Project betterments, was prepared and distributed to MFP stakeholders on June 20, 2006 for a 60-day review and comment period. In addition, PCWA presented Project description and operation information at several Plenary and TWG meetings held in 2006 and 2007. During these meetings, updated materials, including tables and maps, were distributed to the meeting participants. Information about Project facilities and about operation and maintenance activities was discussed early in the relicensing process to assist stakeholders in the identification of potential resource issues and development of the TSPs included in SD H. The final Detailed Existing Project Description is contained in SD B.

Discussion with stakeholders regarding proposed Project Betterments/Improvements occurred during Plenary meetings held on June 20, 2006, July 18, 2006, February 5, 2007, May 8, 2007, June 26, 2007, and October 2, 2007. A preliminary description of the Proposed Project Betterments/Improvements was included in the Draft Project Description distributed to MFP stakeholders on June 20, 2006. Updated materials, pertaining to the Proposed Project Betterments/Improvements were distributed to relicensing participants at subsequent meetings. The potential Project Betterments/Improvements currently under consideration are included in SD C.

1.4 PREPARATION OF AN EXISTING RESOURCE INFORMATION REPORT

PCWA developed an Existing Resource Information Report, which summarizes existing resource information relevant to the relicensing of MFP. The Existing Resource Information Report is organized to address the specific content requirements outlined in the FERC's regulations and includes the following sections: Description of the River Basin; Geology and Soils; Water Use; Water Quality; Fish and Aquatic Resources; Botanical and Wildlife Resources; Geomorphology; Riparian Resources; Land Use; Aesthetic Resources; Cultural Resources; Tribal Resources, and; Socioeconomics. The Existing Resource Information Report is presented in SD F and includes all "existing, relevant, and reasonably available" information regarding each of these resources. The information contained in this report is intended to be used to help identify issues and related information needs, develop study requests and study plans, and will eventually be used as a basis for information presented in PCWA's Application for New License.

Draft versions of the individual sections of the Existing Resource Information Report were provided to the resource agencies and other interested parties (stakeholders) for review and comment before developing and circulating the Pre-Application Document (PAD). As shown in Table SD I-4, the individual sections were distributed in three series dated June, July and August 2006. The purpose of early distribution was to help facilitate the identification of data gaps, additional data sources, potential resource issues, and Project nexus. In addition, PCWA wanted to provide the stakeholders with

existing information early in the process so that it could be used and considered while developing the TSPs.

Written comments on individual sections of the Draft Existing Resource Information Report were provided by Julie Leimbach of the Foothills Water Network by e-mail dated August 15, 2006. Ms. Leimbach's comments focused on whitewater boating and aquatic resources. In addition, Patricia Gibbs and Antonio Rossman provided comment letters dated May 23, 2007 and June 19, 2007, respectively. These letters focused primarily on the Western States Trail and the Western States and Tevis Cup Endurance races. No other written comments were received. Oral comments were intermittently provided during various TWG meetings or during informal meetings with the resource agencies. All comments received to date have been addressed in the Existing Resource Information Report presented in SD F.

1.5 EARLY DATA GATHERING ACTIVITIES

Starting in January of 2005, PCWA began collaborating with the resource agencies and Native American Tribes to develop consensus on TSPs for early data gathering activities proposed by PCWA. PCWA developed Draft Study Plans addressing the following topics: channel geomorphology, riparian habitat, aquatic habitat, water temperature, hydrology, and cultural resources. The Draft Study Plans were distributed to the resource agencies for review and comment and a number of meetings and site visits were held to discuss and refine the study plans. The geomorphology, riparian habitat, and aquatic habitat study plans were refined in early 2006 in collaboration with the resource agencies based on a review of data collection completed in 2005. The Final Study Plans, which address comments provided by the resource agencies, are included in SD G. Table SD I-5 summarizes the dates that the Draft and Final Study Plans were distributed, and the dates of related meetings and site visits.

Implementation of the early data gathering activities was carried out in 2005 and 2006. Draft Study Reports documenting the 2005 study results were distributed to the resource agencies in early 2006 for review and comment. Two joint agency meetings were held to discuss comments on the Draft Study Reports. Final Study Reports were distributed later in 2006 and are provided in SD G. Similarly, Draft Study Reports documenting the 2006 study results were distributed in early 2007 for review and comment. The Final 2006 Study Reports are included in SD G. Table SD I-6 summarizes the dates that the Draft and Final study reports were distributed, and the dates of related meetings.

PAD Technical Study Plan Development and Implementation

PCWA and MFP stakeholders collaboratively developed TSPs for inclusion in the PAD. As shown on Table SD I-2 and SD I-7, a total of seven Plenary meetings and 40 TWG meetings were convened during development of the study plans from August 2006 - November 2007. Consensus on the TSPs was first reached by the TWG followed by approval by the Plenary. A total of 28 detailed TSPs were developed and organized into five major resource areas - Aquatic (AQ), Cultural (CUL), Land (LAND), Recreation (REC), and Terrestrial (TERR). The stakeholder-approved TSPs are included in SD H.

PCWA initiated select elements of the approved PAD TSPs in May 2007. The following major elements of the PAD study plans were completed in 2007: selection of flow modeling transects; fish, amphibian, and macroinvertebrates surveys; water quality sampling; recreation user counts; cultural resource inventories; vegetation community and wildlife habitat mapping; and bat surveys. This information will be shared with stakeholders in a series of Technical Study Reports, which will be distributed in early 2008. The remainder of the studies presented in the PAD will be completed in 2008 and 2009.
