NOTICE DISMISSING MOTION TO INTERVENE

(March 25, 2008)

On December 13, 2007, in Project No. 2079-061, Placer County Water Agency (Placer County) filed a Notice of Intent to File a License Application and a Pre-Application Document (PAD) under the Commission's integrated licensing process (ILP) for the Middle Fork American River Project. On March 19, 2008, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) filed a motion to intervene in this proceeding.

Pursuant to Rule 214(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, any person may seek to intervene and become a party in a proceeding by filing a motion to intervene that complies with the content requirements of Rule 214(b).¹ However, a motion to intervene in the ILP at the *pre*-application stage is not appropriate. Because Placer County has not yet filed a license application, there is no proceeding in which to intervene, and the motion to intervene in Project No. 2079-061 is dismissed as premature. Should Placer County file an actual license application, the Commission will then provide an opportunity for intervention.²

This notice constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing of this notice may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this notice, pursuant to Rule 713 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.³
